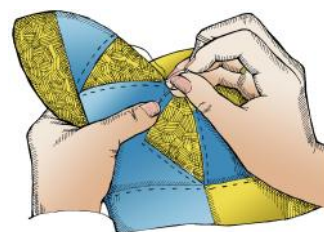

Agenda:

Motion to approve agenda with additions to Old Business and New Business by Alice Smith and Sue Johnson seconded. Motion passed.

August Minutes:

Motioned to accept the minutes by Alice Smith and seconded by Sue Johnson. Motion passed.

Financial Report:

Steve Huffman emailed the council members November Financial Reports

Total income for November was \$9,878.31. Total expenses were \$13,136.15.

Preschool's income was \$10,743.79. Total expenses were \$9,339.87.

Total Summary was \$-1,853.92.

Checking account as of 11/30/25 is \$257,912.49. Investment fund balance on 11/30/25 was \$398,254.65. Weekly offerings have averaged \$2,389. \$3999 is needed weekly to cover operating expenses.

Motion to approve financial report was made by Beth Margraf and seconded by Alice Smith.

Old Business:

Earl Mechanical – They have begun to focus on the big project. Diane called them on Monday regarding the air handler recycling too often and to notify them the thermostat in FISH room is not working correctly.

FISH status: Diane assured them we will fix the room. They have gotten some monetary donations and our donations from the basket are given as extras.

Congregational Meeting: It will be January 25 after service. A baked potato bar will also be available on that date.

Discussion on CROSSWAEH: A discussion incurred on using people from CROSSWAEH as an option for help around the church. It gives them community service hours.

New Business:

Events in December: Christmas Eve will have one service this year at 7:00pm.

New Family: Two new families with young children will be joining the congregation.

Room Requests: Council approved room requests for Life Screening on 6/23/26 and Red Cross on 3/12/26 and 5/14/26.

Visitations for shut ins: Diane announced Father Brian and Deacon Sherry will be doing visitations for the shut ins. Father Brian is from Fostoria. He can only do Monday, Wednesdays and Fridays visitations. He charges \$175.00 for the day plus 77cents for mileage. We may have another lady for a supply pastor and/or to have office hours.

Committee Reports:

Childhood Ministry – Jane Frederick will finish out the school year before retiring. Two different ladies called about the job. Jane is working on trying to find a replacement.

Worship & Music – Summary of a written report given to council stated they met December 3. Kelly King came Nov. 29 th from 5:30-9:00 to evaluate the dimmer board. He discovered the module needs repair. It was decided this module will be mailed to Mr. Chris Aeur, whom was familiar with the unit, to repair it. Overview of the Advent /Christmas services was given by Mr. King. Poinsettias were ordered. Work will begin on filling worship opportunities in January by Melissa Chester. Thank you was expressed to Deb Nominee on the excellent Thanksgiving feast. Final corrections were made to the Wedding Booklet. The Nave will be decorated for Christmas on the 21 st after church. Next meeting will be January 7 th at 6:00.

Transition Committee – Deb Nominee reported they will have meeting in January 6, at 6:00 at New Riegel Café with Arcadia regarding sharing a pastor. The committee has discussed the duties and wants from a future pastor.

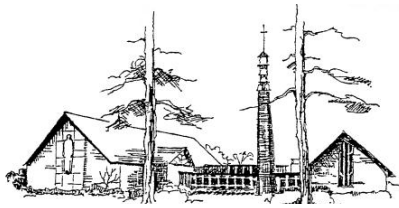
Property Report: No report given.
